Dear Colleagues,

On behalf of the European Shoulder Associates (ESA), a section of the European Society of Sports Traumatology, Knee Surgery and Arthroscopy (ESSKA), we cordially invite you to the First ESA Meeting "Management of failed shoulder surgery", which will be held in Rome, Italy. This is the first official meeting of ESA after its foundation as the ESSKA section dedicated to shoulder surgery.

The meeting will focus on the management of failures of surgical treatment of different pathological conditions around the shoulder, such as: instability of the glenohumeral joint and of the acromio-clavicular joint, rotator cuff disease and pathology of the long head of the biceps tendon, and glenohumeral osteoarthritis. There will also be a special focus on failure of shoulder arthroplasty.

Current status of management of failures of shoulder surgical procedures will be presented by leading ESA experts together with other noted shoulder experts. This will be a "consensus meeting" with peer-reviewed lectures and panel discussions of challenging cases. We will use the voting system for greater interaction during sessions.

The meeting represents a great opportunity to address controversial topics about the shoulder and may lead to a valid update for orthopedic surgeons which may also extend to other medical and health practitioners, such as: sports medicine doctors, physical medicine doctors, and physical therapists.

ESA, in the best traditions of ESSKA, stands for "Excellence in Shoulder Treatment" and this will be demonstrated at the meeting.

The Eternal City will be a perfect location for this first ESA Meeting. Rome is one of the world's most attractive cities - not surprising when you remember what's here -The Vatican, the Trevi Fountain, St Peter's Square, Spanish Steps, Colosseum.

Rome is a romantic place, where modern and old, past and present go side by side, all the time.

Enjoy your first ESA meeting in Rome!

The NH Collection Roma Vittorio Veneto hotel is in the heart of Rome. It's near the city's most popular street, Via Veneto, and the spectacular Villa Borghese park. As for the building itself, it was once a Vatican-owned convent, but a 2009 refurbishment has given it plenty of contemporary style.

HOW TO GET TO THE MEETING VENUE

The NH Collection Roma Vittorio Veneto hotel is easily accessible whether you are arriving by air, rail or road.

By air - Fiumicino Airport

The hotel is located 30 km from the airport. You may take a train to Stazione Termini. From there, you can take the underground (Line A) and get off at either Barberini or Spagna. You may also take a taxi.

By train

NH Collection Roma Vittorio Veneto is located 3 Km from Termini Station. You can take a bus (line 910) and get off Via Puccini, or you can take the underground (Line A) and get off at Piazza di Spagna, following signs for Villa Borghese. Alternatively, you can take a taxi: the station is five minutes from the hotel.

By car

From the north: From A1: Take the exit onto A1 towards Tangenziale Ovest/Bologna (toll road). Take the exit toward Roma/Grande Raccordo Anulare/Civitavecchia/Roma Nord/Rieti. Merge onto A1dir and take the Settebagni exit towards Via Salaria/SS4. Keep right at the fork and follow signs for Settebagni/Roma Centro, then merge onto Via Salaria/SS4. Continue to follow SS4 and continue onto Via Salaria. Keep right at the fork and turn left at Via Carlo Zecchi. Take the first right onto Via Salaria and then turn right at Corso d'Italia. The hotel is on the right-hand side.

From the south: From A14: Continue onto A16 (toll road). Take the exit onto A30 towards Caserta/Roma. Take the exit onto A1 towards Roma/Caserta Nord. Take the exit towards Roma Centro/Roma Est and merge onto A24. Take the exit towards Via Tiburtina. Keep right at the fork and follow signs for Tiburtina. Turn right at Via Tiburtina, make a U-turn and continue on to Piazza delle Crociate. At Piazzale delle Provincie, take the second exit onto Via Catani, continue onto Via Giovanni Battista Morgagni, and then continue onto Viale del Policlinico. Head slightly left at Sottovia Ignazio Guidi and continue onto Corso d'Italia. The hotel is on the right-hand side.

TERRAZZA CAFFARELLI - In Piazzale Caffarelli 4

The Caffarelli Terrace is a part of Palazzo Caffarelli. The building work of the Palazzo was begun by Ascanio Caffarelli in 1538 and over the centuries the palazzo has undergone a number of alterations which have substantially modified its original appearance. Some remaining parts of the frescoed vaulted ceiling are now housed in the Museums of Rome. From the beginning of the 19th century till the end of the First World War the building was occupied by the Prussian Embassy. In 1918 it was taken back by the Rome City Council and partially demolished and the Caffarelli Terrace took the place of the upper floors in the Eastern wing. Terrazza Caffarelli is today one of the most evocative locations in Rome, hosting exclusive receptions, meetings and conventions, and fully equipped for events both in summer and in winter.
